English

Sound Book: The sounds and words are attached at the end of this document — to be stuck into their sound books.

- May $18^{th} 22^{nd}$: 'oa' all the alternative spellings for the sound oa /oa/ as in goat, /ow/ as in snow and /o e/ as in pole.
- May $25^{th} 29^{th}$ 'ue' all the alternative spellings for the sound ue /ue/ as in glue, /ew/ as in few and /u e/ as in tune.

<u>Tricky words</u>: Continuous revision – refer to examples of the sight word games! Colour by sight word, Sight Word Stomp, Go fish/Memory Game, Sight word fly swat, Sight word Bingo.

Phonics Pupil Book 3: Complete pages 23 - 30

Note on Dictation – p.24 & 28

In school, we call out two sentences for the children to write into their books. These sentences contain the tricky words they have been practicing. There is no rush in completing this task and we keep calling out the sentence as many times as is needed. Also, you can call out the full sentence at first, but then repeat it one or two words at a time – whatever is easier for your child. You can also remind

your child to use capital letters at the beginning of the sentence, spaces between their words and a full stop at the end.

Dictation Sentences for page 24:

- 1. He goes to the pool by bus.
- 2. They must count them two by two.
- 3. A dog has four legs.
- 4. We went right then left.

Dictation sentences for page 28:

- 1. He does not swim with the rest.
- 2. She made a big car with some boxes.
- 3. They hang their coats on the pegs.

Note on writing pages - 25 & 29:

Children write about the topic (My Best Day & My Game) with some guidance:

- Talk about the topic and make up sentences orally.
- Write some 'help words' on a piece of paper and guide the children as they write their sentences encouraging them to 'sound out' any words they are stuck on.
- Remember to leave spaces between words, use a capital letter at the beginning and a full stop at the end of a sentence.
- At this stage the children's spelling will not always be accurate, but their work will be readable. Spelling gradually improves through reading many books and learning the alternative lettersound spellings (like in their sound books).
- Draw a picture in the picture frame.

Reading: Continue exposing your child to as much reading material as you can at this time.

Engage Levelled Readers

In school, the children read a lot of levelled readers from various schemes. One of these is the Engage Series which the children know and enjoy in school.

Folens have kindly made the Engage set of books available for free online.

- The Children of Lir: There once lived a king called Lir. He had four children a daughter called Fionnuala and three sons called Aodh, Fiachra and Conn. The queen, Aoibh, was a kind woman and her family loved her dearly. Sadly, she died and Lir and the children were heartbroken. Lir married a woman called Aoife who was thought to have magical powers. The children's stepmother was a mean, selfish woman. She wanted all of Lir's attention for herself and was jealous of his love for Fionnuala and the boys. One day Aoife took the children to Lough Derravaragh to swim. There she cast an evil spell and turned the children into four white swans. They could still speak and had beautiful singing voices. Aoife told them they would have to spend the next 300 years on Lough Derravaragh, then another 300 years on The Sea of Moyle and 300 more on Inishglora. Lir was devastated.
