# English

Sound Book: The sounds and words are attached at the end of this document – to be stuck into their sound books.

- May  $5^{th} 8^{th}$ : 'ee' all the alternative spellings for the sound ee /ee/ as in seed, /ea/ as in read, /e\_e/ as in eve, /y/ at the end as in happy.
- May 11<sup>th</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> 'ie' all the alternative spellings for the sound ie /ie/ as in tie, /igh/ as in night, /i\_e/ as in mine, /y/ at the end as in fly.

<u>Tricky words</u>: Continuous revision – refer to last fortnight's examples of the sight word games! Colour by sight word, Sight Word Stomp, Go fish/Memory Game, Sight word fly swat, Sight word Bingo.

Phonics Pupil Book 3: Complete pages 16 - 22

#### Note on Dictation – p.17 & 21

`In school, we call out two sentences for the children to write into their books. These sentences contain the tricky words they have been practicing. There is no rush in completing this task and we keep calling out the sentence as many times as is needed. Also, you can call out the full sentence at first, but then repeat it one or two words at a time – whatever is easier for your child. You can also remind your child to use capital letters at the beginning of the sentence, spaces between their words and a full stop at the end.

Dictation Sentences for page 17:

- 1. Put the map in the car.
- 2. We saw some frogs in the pond.

Dictation sentences for page 21:

- 1. We could sing a song next.
- 2. It should be a good outing.
- 3. It would be fun to go on the swings.

## Note on writing pages -18 & 22:

Children write about the topic (My Best Dinner & The animal I like best is...) with some guidance:

Note: You could link the writing page 'The animal I like best is...' with the genre story eBook from Over the Moon (further information below)

- Talk about the topic and make up sentences orally.
- Write some 'help words' on a piece of paper and guide the children as they write their sentences encouraging them to 'sound out' any words they are stuck on.
- Remember to leave spaces between words, use a capital letter at the beginning and a full stop at the end of a sentence.
- At this stage the children's spelling will not always be accurate, but their work will be readable. Spelling gradually improves through reading many books and learning the alternative lettersound spellings (like in their sound books).
- Draw a picture in the picture frame.

**Reading:** Continue exposing your child to as much reading material as you can at this time.

#### Over the Moon

We have been following the Over the Moon Programme this year and their online resources are excellent. The children really enjoy our Over the Moon lessons at school. Each month we cover one Unit/Theme. The topic for Unit 08, for the month of May, is **The Zoo**.

**Remember:** This topic would normally take four weeks so try not to rush through it if you decide to use it!! For this fortnight, focus on the <u>Oral Language Poster</u> (worksheet attached) and <u>Genre Story</u> **eBook** (worksheets attached).

# SESE (Geography/History/Science):

Theme of the Month: Water

# • Science: Is It Waterproof?

- Vocabulary: Waterproof, absorb, umbrella, material, plastic, cotton wool, pipette, fabric, bubble wrap.
- Equipment: Bowl of water, tin foil, paper towel (kitchen roll), cotton wool, plastic, bubble wrap (could substitute with cling film or somethings else), pipette (turkey baster/straw/something similar)
- Allow the child to drop a small amount of water on each material to test whether it is waterproof or not.
- Ask which materials absorbed water and which materials were waterproof.


# History: The Lighthouse Keeper

- Vocabulary: Lighthouse, keeper, oil, electricity, fog
- Read the story 'Michael the Lighthouse Keeper' to the child and discuss.
- Worksheet Attached.

Michael the Lighthouse Keeper: My name is Michael and I worked as a lighthouse keeper for many, many years a long time ago. It was very hard work but I loved it. The hardest thing about the job was being away from my wife and children for long stretches of time. I would work at the lighthouse for weeks on end and then have two weeks off to go home and see my family. When I was at the lighthouse I worked with two other men — Desmond and Billy. They became great friends of mine. We checked to make sure the light was well lit. It wasn't electric then, it was an oil lamp in

those days. We had to make sure it flashed at the right time too; there were no computers to control it like they have today. We also kept an eye out for fog. When it was foggy one keeper manned the light and one manned the fog signal. The fog signal made a loud sound out across the sea to warn all the ships to be extra careful because they were close to land. We also kept the lighthouse clean and tidy. If we weren't manning the light we were busy cleaning and polishing. We were very proud of our lighthouse and always kept it in 'shipshape'!
