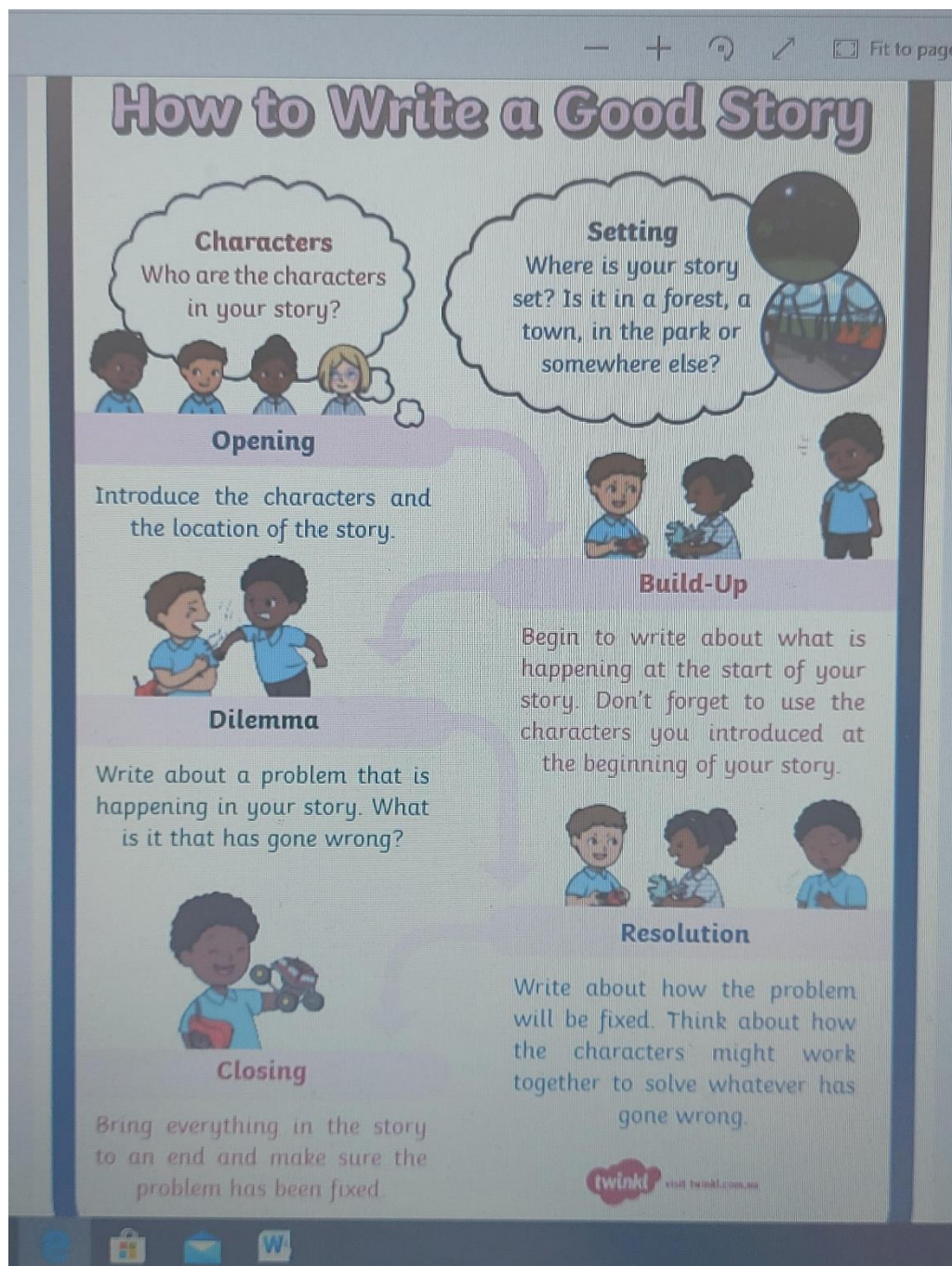
Features of the Genre:
