English

Sound Book: The sounds and words are attached at the end of this document – to be stuck into their sound books.

- June $2^{nd} 5^{th}$: 'ou' the alternative spellings for the sound ou /ou/ as in out and /ow/ as in cow. (Hint: if a word ends in the ou sound it is always spelled ow - cow, now etc. a word would not end in **ou**)
- June 8th 12th: 'oi' all the alternative spellings for the sound oi /oi/ as in boil, /oy/ as in toy. (Hint: if a word ends in the oi sound it is always spelled oy — boy, toy, enjoy etc. a word would not end in oi)

Tricky words: Continuous revision – refer to examples of the sight word games! Colour by sight word, Sight Word Stomp, Go fish/Memory Game, Sight word fly swat, Sight word Bingo.

Phonics Pupil Book 3: Complete pages 31 - 38

Note on Dictation – p. 32 & 36

In school, we call out two sentences for the children to write into their books. These sentences contain the tricky words they have been practicing. There is no rush in completing this task and we keep calling out the sentence as many times as is needed. Also, you can call out the full sentence at first, but then repeat it one or two words at a time – whatever is easier for your child. You can also remind your child to use capital letters at the beginning of the sentence, spaces between their words and a full stop at the end.

Dictation Sentences for page 32:

This time, rather than completing sentences, the children have to fill in the gaps and complete a story - with your guidance. The tricky words once, upon and always fit into the three spaces and after this the children can decide what to write themselves or you can call out a story to them!

Dictation sentences for page 36:

1. She also waits for the bus.

- 2. They counted eight hundred ants.
- 3. She put a pinch of nutmeg in the mix

Note on writing pages - 33 & 37:

Children write about the topic (Re-telling a story & My Best Story) with some guidance:

- Re-telling a story: children can re-tell their favourite story from a book, movie etc.
- My Best Story: this could also be a favourite story of theirs.
- Talk about the topic and make up sentences orally.
- Write some 'help words' on a piece of paper and quide the children as they write their sentences encouraging them to 'sound out' any words they are stuck on.
- Remember to leave spaces between words, use a capital letter at the beginning and a full stop at the end of a sentence.
- At this stage the children's spelling will not always be accurate, but their work will be readable. Spelling gradually improves through reading many books and learning the alternative lettersound spellings (like in their sound books).
- Draw a picture in the picture frame.

Reading: Continue exposing your child to as much reading material as you can at this time.

SESE (Geography/History/Science):

Theme of the Month: Summer

There is a worksheet for each lesson attached at the end of this document. You can do these orally, recreate on a piece of paper/copybook or print them if you wish.

• Science: Floating and Sinking

- Vocabulary: float, sink, predict, basin, water, coin, paperclip, cork, chalk, lego, lollipop stick
- Equipment: basin of water, a coin, a paperclip, a cork, a piece of chalk, a piece of Lego and a lollipop stick. (Don't be afraid to substitute these for other materials at home if you can't find them)
- Tell the children that they are going to investigate whether items float or sink. They must predict orally what they think will happen. Then one by one they place the items into the basin.
- Record the results in the table; Worksheet attached

• History: We Went Camping!

- Vocabulary: camping, campfire, tent, marshmallows, songs, dinner, cook, sausages, sleeping bag.
- Read the story Fionn's Camping Trip
- Ask your child to recall in sequence the things that Fionn and his family did.
- Worksheet Attached

Fionn's Camping Trip: Sparky: Did you have fun on your camping trip, Fionn? Fionn: It was so much fun! First, we had to pack up the car. We packed some clothes, our tent, our sleeping bags and some food. When we arrived at the campsite we had to pitch our tent. This is a difficult job so we all had to help. When the tent was up we went for a long walk in the forest. We saw lots of trees. My dad played hide and seek with me! We were very hungry after our walk, so Mam and Dad lit the campfire and we cooked our dinner on it. We ate sausages and beans. After dinner, Dad took out his guitar and we sang songs. We toasted marshmallows on long sticks. When it was bedtime, we snuggled into our sleeping bags and went to sleep in the tent!

• Geography: A Campsite Map

- Vocabulary: compass, north, south, east, west, map, direction.
- Look at the compass points on the picture in the worksheet attached.
- Explain to the child that people use a compass to know the direction the yare going in. There are four points on a simple compass north, south, east and west.








A Campsite Map
